



ISSF RULE INTERPRETATION,
in force as from JANUARY 1st 2004

Rule AMENDMENTS
in force as from 01.01.2004

| article | A m e n d m e n t |
|---------------------------|--|
| Valid for all disciplines | Side blinders attached to the hat, cap, shooting glasses, or to a head band, not exceeding 40mm deep are permitted. These blinders must not extend further forward than to a line from the center of the forehead. |
| Valid for all disciplines | If attached to a hat or cap the lowest point of the blinder must not be lower than if the blinder was attached to shooting glasses or to a head band. |
| Valid for all disciplines | A piece to cover the non aiming eye not larger than 30 mm wide is permitted. |
| 7.4.2.3.3 | A blinder may be attached to the rifle or to the rear sight. The blinder must not be more than 30mm deep nor extend further than 100mm from the center of the rear sight aperture on the side of the non aiming eye. A blinder must not be used on the side of the aiming eye. |
| 10.14.2.2.3 | All shooters with tied scores are allowed to shoot two (2) sighting shots (one (1) left – one (1) right). After the completion of the sighting shots each shooter will shoot two (2) additional competition shots (one (1) left – one (1) right) in 2.5 seconds (fast run) on commands as mentioned in Rule 10.14.8.3 for tied scores in Finals. |
